2022-23 Training Schedule

The TAALC Communication Project will host three Core Vocabulary trainings this year. These free trainings are designed for anyone who works with students with complex communication needs. Please share this information with Special Educators, Speech Language Pathologists, Teachers of the Visually Impaired, Paraprofessionals, General Educators, and anyone else who may wish to attend. Teams are encouraged to attend.

Each training will focus on a specific communication topic that builds one upon the other for continuous communication programming and implementation. Each training will be held on a Tuesday afternoon from **3:00pm – 5:00pm Eastern/2:00pm – 4:00pm Central** times.

The training schedule and links for registration are as follows:

1) Tuesday, September 27, 2022 Planning Communication – SETT Framework

This session will focus communication teams on using the C-SETT Framework, an adaption of the Student, Environment, Task, Tool (SETT), to identify communication forms and intents, preferences, access factors, instructional targets, and intervention options for a student who needs Augmentative Alternative Communication (AAC). Teams will be guided through the process of completing a C-SETT framework and developing an AAC implementation plan for a target student. Teams will have the opportunity to work on the SETT framework in breakout rooms during this training.

*2.5-hour PD certificate and 2.5 hours of ASHA CEUs are available upon completion of the following: 2 hours of online training plus an additional ½ hour to work with your team to complete the SETT framework after training. Submit the completed SETT framework to the TAALC project to receive the certificate and/or ASHA CEUs.

2) Tuesday, October 25, 2021 <u>Peer Supports for Communication:</u> The Power of P3 – Peers, Parents, and Paraprofessionals

This session will focus on strategies that support communication and the use of AAC in inclusive general education settings utilizing peer support strategies. Teams will be guided through the process of setting up peer support arrangements, with an emphasis on what students might need to know to successfully interact and work together; and what adults (e.g., teachers, paraprofessionals, SLPs) need to know to facilitate the student interactions. Teams will have the opportunity to work in breakout rooms to plan implementation of peer support arrangements for students with communication support needs. *2-hour PD certificates available upon completion of the training. 2.0 hours of ASHA CEUs pending.

3) Tuesday, March 28, 2023 Communication Strategies: Teach, Tally, Track

This session will focus teams on communication teaching strategies including Aided Language Modeling, creating communication opportunities through managing the environment, waiting for communicative attempts, and expanding communication models. Teams will consider strategies for tracking communication data and implementing data-informed decisions. Finally, teams will complete action plans for improving communication outcomes through AAC use. * 2-hour PD certificates and 2.0 hours of ASHA CEUs available upon completion of the training.



Introduction to Core Vocabulary

This session will introduce core vocabulary communication systems for students with significant disabilities and complex communication needs. Considerations in the development and use of core vocabulary will be described and include low- and high-tech options for students who need augmentative communication and evidence-based strategies for implementation.
