If your only income is from SSI and your job, when your paycheck reaches \$1,971 per month, your SSI cash benefit will stop. But you will still receive Medicaid until your income reaches Kentucky's threshold amount.

Kentucky's current threshold income is \$45,921 per year!

STABLE Kentucky accounts provide financial independence and empowerment for individuals with disabilities by dramatically increasing the ability to save and invest. STABLE Kentucky allows individuals with disabilities (whose disability occurred before the age of 26) to save and invest up to \$18,000 annually without affecting eligibility for SSI and Medicaid.
