A graduate certificate in developmental disabilities is ideal for professionals in education, healthcare, or social services who wish to deepen their knowledge of the unique needs, challenges, and support strategies for individuals with developmental disabilities.

Graduate Certificate Program

The UK Human Development Institute and the College of Education have partnered to offer this certificate program. Coursework emphasizes an interdisciplinary approach. Students have the opportunity to conduct a research project, participate in a practicum, and work with individuals with developmental disabilities along with the individual's family, to gain invaluable field experience. Classes are offered in a hybrid format on Friday mornings and a \$2,500 stipend is available on a limited basis.
